



Interdisciplinary Treatment of Pain and Foundational Principles Regarding Addiction, Pain and Opioids

Program Description

Chronic pain is a challenge for patients and health care providers. Opioids which have traditionally served as the back bone of treatment have little evidence-based and well documented harms. The need for a different approach is clear. Strategies that offer an inter-disciplinary approach to pain including physical therapy, acupuncture, chiropractic medicine as well as a more robust understanding of addiction, opioid and their consequences are needed. In this activity, subject matter experts will discuss these disciplines and their roles in treating chronic pain. The overall goal of this activity is for health care providers to more appropriately prescribe opioids, specifically much less, and consider more inter-disciplinary approaches to treating patients with chronic pain.

Who Should Attend

Physicians, Dentists, Physician Assistants, Advanced Practice Pharmacists, APRNs, Residents, & Fellows who prescribe controlled substances.

Educational Objectives

At the conclusion of these activities, participants should be able to:

- Discuss addiction as it pertains to opioids, including risk factors and treatment
- Discuss evidence-based guidelines for treating pain
- Describe and prescribe various inter-disciplinary approaches to treating pain when appropriate.
