Hasbro Children's Hospital is part of the St. Damien Collaborative to Improve Pediatrics in Haiti, a new consortium of six US-based Children's Hospitals dedicated to building capacity for pediatric care in Haiti at St. Damien Hospital for sick children.

Following the conference, a Gala event will be held to raise funds in support of both St. Damien, the premier pediatric hospital in Haiti providing services free of charge and funded through donations from benefactors all over the world; and The Haitian Project, a Providence-based non-profit which supports and operates Louverture Cleary School, a Catholic, tuition-free, co-educational secondary boarding school in Croix des Bouquets, Haiti for students whose families cannot afford the cost of their children's education.





PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The world is becoming more interconnected with a need for a global approach to healthcare. Migration and increased foreign travel have mitigated geographic barriers of disease transmission. Global health seeks interconnected solutions to problems of economic development, access to quality health care, and barriers to care. This conference seeks to provide examples of successful, long-term, global partnerships and allow networking for new and experienced global health providers. This will be the second annual conference for the St. Damien Collaborative to Improve Pediatrics in Haiti (SCIPH) which includes six US-based children's hospital partners. International leaders in pediatric global health will address sustainable partnerships, cultural competency, research, medical education and service through lectures, panel discussions, and breakout sessions.
